HI TIP: Together In Prayer

Each month we focus on a local community concern and ask parishioners to commit to praying for 2 minutes each day specifically for that concern as well as for our church community. You can pray whenever and wherever you want. "Ask and you will receive" said Jesus. Together we can do great things.

BAPTISMS

The celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism for infants is scheduled after the baptismal preparation for the parents are completed. Baptisms are normally celebrated at a Sunday Mass in the parish where the parents live. Adults (7-years or older) seeking baptism or confirmation are invited to inquire at the parish office for information about adult preparation.

MARRIAGE

Couples seeking marriage in the Church are asked to contact the parish at least four months in advance of their proposed wedding date. For those with prior marriages, additional time may be required. Marriages are celebrated in the parish in which one of the Catholic parties lives.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION (CONFESSION)

Private confession is available on the 1st Sunday of the month between the 8 am and 10:30 am Masses. Confession is available on Saturdays at St. Jude's in Redmond from 4 to 4:30 pm. There are also communal reconciliation services with private confession during Advent and Lent. Fr. Heric is also available by appointment.

PASTORAL CARE FOR THE SICK & DYING

In the case of serious illness or failing health due to old age, parishioners should ask the church for the Sacrament of Anointing. This sacrament is administered by a priest and is best celebrated communally at a Sunday Mass, but may be offered individually by appointment as necessary. When a parishioner is near death, they should receive Holy Communion, called the Sacrament of Viaticum (*food for the journey*). This sacrament can be administered by a priest, deacon, or a eucharistic minister.

Welcome Tent City 4



Welcome to the residents of Tent City 4. I certainly have not missed the controversy generated around the initial stay a couple of years ago. But that is part of the growing process.

Several of us who were involved last time were recounting what we had learned. We agreed that one of the most important lessons is that one size does not fit all when it comes to issues of homelessness. A few people qualify for Habitat for Humanity residences, some people find a home with extended family, others make shelters work, but for some, Tent City provides a temporary community. The communal aspect is far more vital than I imagined. Folks network for jobs. Some make associations enabling them to pool resources and rent an apartment. Job opportunities are shared. Ways of economizing passed around.

Thank you in advance to St. Jude, Holy Innocents, neighboring churches and organizations who work at various means of addressing homelessness and poverty. Undoubtedly this go round of hosting will provide enriching contacts with inspiring neighbors, churches, organizations, and – of course – residents of Tent City 4..

The purpose of the Stewardship Commission is as follows:

To assist the parish in promoting stewardship as a way of life among parishioners

To engage in strategic planning, policy development and recommendation in the area of stewardship in response to parish priorities and goals;

To ensure education of staff, consultative groups, and parish at large regarding stewardships

To form community committed to stewardship as a way of life, as a witness to the larger parish community.

The commission, living out the parish's mission and pastoral priorities in the context of the USCCB's Stewardship letter: [A Disciple's Response](#), will develop an annual plan for promoting stewardship in the parish and may include supporting the annual campaign for renewal of parishioner's commitments to give of their time, talent and treasure; Encourage the incorporation of appropriate emphasis of stewardship in liturgy and prayer; All areas of faith formation: All parish evangelization and welcoming efforts and Advocating for outreach efforts by the parish.

In addition to supporting our current Catholic Annual Appeal Campaign, the newly formed commission is investigating the establishment of neighborhood groups for our parish community; Promoting a *Discernment of Gifts* Campaign accompanied with a Ministry Fair and looking at preliminary plans for our annual fall picnic.
